SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT

The purpose of the American Legion color guard is to honor the American flag and the sacrifices made by those who have served in the United States Armed Forces. The color guard is typically composed of veterans and active-duty military members. They march in parades, ceremonies, and other events carrying the American flag, the POW/MIA flag, the American Legion flag, and the state flag, and the service flags. The precise meaning of the color guard's actions can vary depending on the specific event, but they generally serve to:

Pay tribute to the American flag and its symbolism. **Remember** those who have served in the military. **Honor** the sacrifices made by those who have died in service to their country. **Promote** patriotism and civic pride

The American Legion color guard is a powerful symbol of American patriotism and military service. Their presence at events reminds us of the importance of these values and the sacrifices that have been made to protect them. Here are some specific examples of the patriotic meaning of an American Legion color guard:

- At a Memorial Day ceremony, the color guard takes a slow march in front of the reviewing stand and visitors. This shows that the flag and the sacrifices of the veterans are at the forefront of the ceremony.
- At a Fourth of July parade, the color guard will lead the parade, followed by other patriotic groups and floats. This shows that the flag is the symbol of the nation and that the parade is a celebration of American freedom.
- On Veterans Day the color Guard will present the colors for ceremonies for the community and schools. This shows respect and honor to all veterans, past and present.
- At a military funeral, the color guard may present the flag when the Honor Guard renders a three-round volley. This is a gesture of respect and honor for the soldier's service.

The American Legion color guard is a reminder of the importance of patriotism and military service. Their presence at events helps to promote these values and to honor those who have sacrificed for their country. I can assure you that I am not the only member of the Post 37 Color Guard who feels a great sense of pride when we participate in an event and get to display the colors of our post, our state, and our country. I hope you all feel the same.



There are also weekend stands at Hy-Vee and Family Fresh, which are hosted by Auxiliary members. This year also marks my final year with this project and my sister, Rebekah, will take over in 2024.

JIM STEFFENSMEIER | AUGUST


